
Temidayo Aganga-Williams Named Among Notable LGBTQIA+ Leaders by Crain's New York Business

Temidayo is also a frequent on-air contributor to CNN and MSNBC on legal developments concerning matters of national importance, including investigations into former President Trump and notable cases before the U.S. Supreme Court. He was also named one of the 500 Leading Lawyers in America by *Lawdragon* and was recognized as a Rising Star by the *New York Law Journal*, which awards the region's most promising and accomplished lawyers who are 40 years or younger.

Prior to joining Selendy Gay, Temidayo served as Senior Investigative Counsel for the House Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the U.S. Capitol.
